The Holy Monastery of Saint Catherine's

The Greek Orthodox monastery of the God-trodden Mount Sinai is located at the very place where God appeared to Moses in the Burning Bush, beneath the Mount of the Decalogue. In the providence of God, it is at this site also that the holy relics of Saint Catherine are enshrined. This is the oldest continuously inhabited Christian monastery, with a history that can be traced back over seventeen centuries. The monastery predates the divisions of the Christian world, its origins extending to late antiquity.

The monastery has never been destroyed in all its history, and thus it can be said to have preserved intact the distinctive qualities of its Greek and Roman heritage. Members of other Christian confessions have honored the monastery, coming as pilgrims to this holy place. But from its beginnings, the Christian inhabitants of Sinai belonged to the Greek speaking world, and it has remained so to this day.

The earliest description refers to the Monastery of the Holy Virgin, for the revelation of God at the Burning Bush was seen as a type of the Virgin Mary and the Incarnation. The monastery is also especially dedicated to the holy prophets Moses and Elias (Elijah), who both came to this mountain, and who both spoke with Christ at the Transfiguration. More recently, it has been known as Saint Catherine's Monastery. This remains its name today, though the monastery has not lost its earlier dedications.

More than one hundred and seventy Sinai saints are honored by the Church. In addition to Saint Catherine, these include Saint John Climacus, abbot of Sinai and author of *The Ladder of Divine Ascent*. They also include the ascetic fathers Hesychios and Philotheus, two saints with the name of Anastasius, Gregory of Sinai (who transplanted the Hesychast traditions to the Slavic peoples), and Symeon Pentaglossos (who translated relics of Saint Catherine to Rouen, and thereby helped establish the veneration of Saint Catherine in the West).

The monastery can be thought of as a veritable Ark for its spiritual treasures. These include the manuscripts and early printed books preserved in the Sinai library, which is celebrated throughout the world for the antiquity and importance of its volumes. It also includes the monastery icons, which include the most important collection of pre-iconoclastic panel icons, and icons of the greatest beauty and significance dating from the time of the Comnene dynasty.

The monastery has been honored by rulers throughout its history. These include the Empress Helena, the Emperor Justinian, Mohammed the Founder of Islam, Sultan Selim I, the Empress Catherine of Russia, and Napoleon Bonaparte. Contemporary heads of state have continued to show their interest in the monastery. The Holy Monastery of Sinai has been celebrated throughout the world for its spiritual and cultural radiance. It has been revered not only by Christians, but also by Moslems and Jews. It has recently been listed by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site, both for its cultural and for its scenic significance.

The monks of Sinai, from earliest times until the present day, maintain a dedication both to prayer and to the support of pilgrims and visitors. They live at peace with the native Bedouin. They maintain the ancient spiritual heritage of Sinai, a heritage that extends from the giving of the Law, through the whole of the Old and New Testaments, to the multitude of saints whose memory has been enshrined at Sinai – above all, to the All-holy Theotokos, to the holy prophets Moses and Elias, and to Saint Catherine.

The Feast of the 12 Apostles

June 30th

The names of the Twelve Apostles are these: Simon, who was called Peter, and his brother Andrew, the First-called; James the son of Zebedee, and his brother John, who was also the Evangelist and Theologian; Philip, and Bartholomew; Thomas, and Matthew the publican, who was also called Levi and was an Evangelist; James the son of Alphaeus, and Jude (also called Lebbaeus, and surnamed Thaddaeus), the brother of James, the Brother of God; Simon the Cananite (the Zealot), and Matthias, who was elected to fill the place of Judas the traitor.

The following is an excerpt from Saint John Chrysostom from his *Homily on 1 Corinthians 4, 6, 7-8*:

It was clear through unlearned men that the cross was persuasive, in fact, it persuaded the whole world. Their discourse was not of unimportant matters but of God and true religion, of the Gospel way of life and future judgment, yet it turned plain, uneducated men into philosophers. How the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and his weakness stronger than men!

In what way is it stronger? It made its way throughout the world and overcame all men; countless men sought to eradicate the very name of the Crucified, but that name flourished and grew ever mightier. Its enemies lost out and perished; the living who waged a war on a dead man proved helpless. Therefore, when a Greek tells me I am foolish, he shows only that he is foolish indeed, for I, whom he thinks a fool, turn out to be wiser than those reputed wise. So too, in calling me weak, he but shows that he is weaker still. For the good deeds which tax-collectors and fishermen were able to accomplish by God's grace, the philosophers, the rulers, the countless multitudes cannot even imagine.

Paul had this in mind when he said: *The weakness of God is stronger than men* (1 Corinthians 1:25). That the preaching of these men was indeed divine is brought home to us in the same way. For how otherwise could twelve uneducated men, who lived on lakes and rivers and wastelands, get the idea for such an immense enterprise? How could men who perhaps had never been in a city or a public square think of setting out to do battle with the whole world? That they were fearful, timid men, the evangelist makes clear; he did not reject the fact or try to hide their weaknesses. Indeed he turned these into a proof of the truth. What did he say of them? That when Christ was arrested, the others fled, despite all the miracles they had seen, while he who was leader of the others denied him!

How then account for the fact that these men, who in Christ's lifetime did not stand up to the attacks by the Jews, set forth to do battle with the whole world once Christ was dead - if, as you claim, Christ did not rise and speak to them and rouse their courage? Did they perhaps say to themselves: "What is this? He could not save himself but he will protect us? He did not help himself when he was alive, but now that he is dead he will extend a helping hand to us? In his lifetime he brought no nation under his banner, but by uttering his name we will win over the whole world?" Would it not be wholly irrational even to think such thoughts, much less to act upon them?

It is evident, then, that if they had not seen him risen and had proof of his power, they would not have risked so much.

Pastoral Visit of Elder Pavlos of Sinai



On **Sunday, June 17th**, Elder Pavlos will join us for the Divine Liturgy, and host a presentation and discussion during Coffee Fellowship. Father Pavlos is the senior monk and an ascetic of ancient Saint Catherine's Monastery at Mount Sinai, Egypt. He speaks on the mystery of simplicity of soul, which captivated the ascetic saints of the Sinai desert as requisite to the ultimate Christian goal of union with God (*theosis*). Stepping 'off the grid' into a forbidding environment of granite mountains which offered neither protection from the elements nor basic dietary sustenance, these early monastics discounted extreme privation in order to experience divine revelation, which they recorded in famous works such as *The Ladder of Divine Ascent*, by Saint John Climacus of Sinai, universally considered the most important spiritual manual in the history of the Christian tradition, secondary only to the Bible.

A 1972 graduate of the School of Theology of the University of Athens, Elder Pavlos is a desert ascetic himself with four decades of immersion in this tradition, which preserves the totality of the knowledge, mainly lost from Western forms of Christianity, by which Christianity is not an ethical system, but the personal experience of peace, without which ethical systems remain in the abstract.

Therefore the elder conveys the revelations of the spiritual athletes of the Sinai from the early Byzantine period of the 4th through 8th centuries, not simply on the basis of their recorded experiences, but through the illumination of his personal experience of this unbroken tradition at the roots of the Burning Bush where it began. As the oldest continuously-functioning Monastery in the world, St. Catherine's lays claim to the interpretation of this body of wisdom, not as theoretical, but *living* tradition.

Mount Sinai - sacred to all three of the world's monotheistic belief-systems - offers profound commentary to global society on another mystery receiving increasing attention in the media, which Father Pavlos highlights - respectful co-existence with those of differing faith. Without sensing any need to blur the distinctions that characterize its own confession of faith - the common pitfall of today's efforts at reconciling multiculturalism - the Sinai monastery has lived in peace with its non-Christian neighbors for close to two millennia.

Stressing the sanctity of personal freedom for seventeen centuries, the Sinai monks have enjoyed a relationship of mutual respect with the Bedouin tribes with whom they have lived and worked since the dawn of Islam, in the shadow of Mount Sinai where Moses received the Tablets inscribed with the Ten Commandments of the Judaic Law.


